

## Doing the dishes

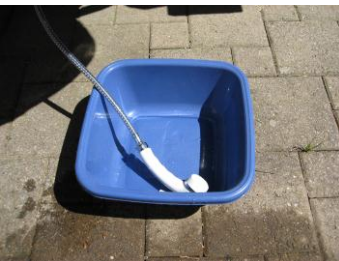
Unfortunately, life isn't all beer and skittles. After the pleasure, I have to go to work. Doing the dishes after a delicious dinner is a necessary evil. Unfortunately, I don't have an electric dish washer in my Zebra that would do this job for me. Therefore, manual equipment is necessary.



For smaller matters like cups, mugs or cutlery, I have installed a mini basin (25 cm diameter). In addition, a water tap and a respective sink that leads directly into free nature. To save the 80 CHF for a camping basin, I bought a stainless steel salade bowl for 15 CHF, drilled a hole in it at the bottom for the sink and was the opinion to get away very cheaply. Unfortunately, this was not the case. Only at the very end of installation I noticed that my basin had no dent for the sink. To fix it at the underside of the bowl was out of question due to security reasons and the sharp borders of the bowl. So I have to live with roughly 2 mm of water in the basin after draining. That I have to accept although the water evaporates during the day. Today I would rather buy a dedicated camping basin.



For doing the dishes on a bigger scale I have my plastic basin. With this I can do the work outside the vehicle. It can be filled with my shower installation. Depending on the dirt (grease or only sauce) I have to heat some water on my stove. Well, my dishes become clean this way but I would not claim that they are clinically pure.



Something that I have missed so far is a small camping boiler (3 litres). Unfortunately I haven't figured out yet where to place it. This will be one of my future projects.
