## Inside storage space





Pictures can tell you more than a thousand words. Here are some examples how I made the most of the limited space in my Zebra. Each object has its dedicated place. This saves me quite some time from searching (although I do not stick to this priciple all the time myself). When I was planning the inside storage I paid a lot of attention that ,life' inside my Zebra is still possible. That is one reason why I banned big and heavy stuff as well as drawer systems from the in-cabin room. However, apart from the permanent installed storage facilities, there is still enough room for sleeping bags, travelling bags or other miscellaneous.





For all interior fittings I employed ,L'-profiles as used in frameworks for shelves. Cabinet doors and walls consist of impregnated 3 mm plywood that I have covered with industrial floor cover. Only the sink and the kitchen working surface is of stainless steel. This construction is light weighted but – through the use of ,L'-profiles - remains elastic enough to withstand vibration and warpage effects when driving on rough territory. Have a look.
